The tournament has evolved over the years, and now brings architects and design professionals together with vendors and allied professionals from A/E/C industries for a day of friendly competition to raise scholarship funds for students facing financial hardship. Proceeds from the tournament will provide scholarships for students studying architecture in America's only 2+2+2 architectural degree program.



Today, in its 32nd year, the tournament has raised over \$315,000.

About Valencia College: Valencia's articulated architecture pre-major facilitates the initial pathway for students interested in Architecture & Design careers. The college provides the foundation & lower division courses in the 2+2+2 degree program.



About UCF School of Architecture: UCF offers a Bachelor of Design in Architecture. This middle step in the 2+2+2 program provides a convenient, affordable, & flexible ways for students to complete their higher education studies in Central Florida.



About UF CityLab-Orlando: CityLab-located in downtown Orlando is the final step in the 2+2+2 program leading to a Master of Architecture degree. The program explores architectural ideas within the context of the city & uses the City of Orlando as a learning laboratory.

Eligibility

2+2+2 Scholarships:

Must be a full-time student enrolled in one of the 2+2+2 programs.

Must be enrolled as a full-time student the semester of the scholarship award.

Must have a minimum 3.40 GPA at the time of application.

Must be a U.S. Citizen.


A 2+2+2 program participant is a student enrolled in an architecture degree program at one of the three participating institutions, Valencia College, University of Central Florida, or University of Florida.

About Irving Teos



Poor planning of system integrations spanning the entirety of given zone within the model, as well as moment integrations with armature, resulted in greater demands for material joints, causing excessive visual noise /clutter.




About Maria Moreno




About Jimmy Delvalle






